



Distance Learning

The Girls' Varsity, Reserve, and Freshmen basketball teams opened practice in late October and open the season on Friday, November 27, at Ohio Wesleyan University against Olentangy Orange HS. Senior letter winner Mandy Lane, Courtney Neff, Heather Manning, Taylor Riggs, and Alyssa Zag return to the varsity team, along with junior Danielle Pugh. Best of luck to all three teams! The Bishop Ready Golf Team capped a successful season with an appearance in the district tournament at Cumberland Trail Golf Course on October 6. Although the Silver Knights finished 7th at the districts, it was an exciting year for golf as the team won the sectional tournament a week earlier to advancer to Cumberland Trail. Senior Tyler Davis led the team with a 78, finishing in a tie for the last qualifying spot to the state tournament; Davis was bested in a one-hole playoff for the trip to the state.

The season started in mid-August with a win over London at the London Country Club as Davis led the Knights as co-medalist with a score of 37 for nine holes. The team then struggled in back-to-back 18-hole tournaments, finishing 5th in the Central Catholic Preview tournament at Riviera Country Club and tied for 11th in the Warrior Invitational at Medallion Country Club. Following these events, the Knights began a string of dual matches in which it went 7-5, which, coupled with the opening win over London, gave Ready a season record of 8-5 in head-to-head matches. In CCL play, the Silver Knights finished tied for 4th.

Heading into the post-season in the sectional tournament at Darby Creek Golf Course in Marysville, the Knights appeared to be the dark horse team to capture one of the two berths into the district tournament, but the team had confidence that it could qualify to move on.

On a brutally cold, cloudy, and windy day in late September, the Silver Knights started off poorly and trailed several teams at the turn. The veteran team never lost hope and put together a tremendous round on the last nine holes to win the sectional tournament with an 18-hole, fourplayer team score of 350, besting perennial sectional champs The Wellington School by four strokes. Ready was led by sophomore Brian Horn, whose 84 allowed him to capture tournament or match medalist honors for the first time in his career. Also contributing to the sectional title were three seniors: Tyler Davis, Jackson Riffle, and Chase Chapman, as well as freshman Kris Clarke. Junior Jacob Fleming and sophomore Blake Harmer alternated as the sixth varsity golfer all season, with each earning varsity letters along with the other five team members.

Seniors Davis, who led the team with seven medalist honors, and Riffle, with two medalist awards, earned first team All-CCL honors, while Chapman (one-time medalist) was named to the CCL-2nd Team.
