Duke University Summer Programs

All students in grade 10 or 11 are invited to spend the summer at [Duke Summer College for High School Students](#). The program offers an opportunity to earn college credit with academically-motivated students from around the world. Also, students in grades 9-12 are invited to spend the summer at [Duke Summer Academy for High School Students](#). This program offers personal enrichment and courses with a global perspective.

Hispanic Scholarship Fund

The HSF Scholarship is designed to assist students of Hispanic heritage obtain a college degree. Awards are based on merit; amounts range from \$500 to \$5,000, based on relative need, among the Scholars selected. Students must have a minimum of 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale, and be a U.S. Citizen, Permanent Legal Resident, DACA, or Eligible Non-Citizen (as defined by FAFSA). As the nation's largest not-for-profit organization supporting Hispanic American higher education, HSF has awarded more than \$550 million in scholarships and provides a range of impactful programs for students, HSF scholars, alumni, and parents. Otterbein University Introduces Aquarium Track

Otterbein's program in Zoo and Conservation Science is expanding to include a specialized path for students interested in Aquarium science.

The innovative Aquarium Track curriculum will give students the opportunity to earn either a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree with a focus on aquariums and marine and freshwater conservation. The Ohio State University MD Camp

MD Camp, sponsored by the Area Health Education Center at The Ohio State University, is looking for applicants for the 2018 MD Summer Camp cohort. MD Camp is a three-week intensive summer camp designed to inspire and motivate students interested in pursuing a career in the health professions, including medicine, biomedical research, and more. MD Camp is an opportunity for rising high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors who might benefit from the intellectual challenge, academic and social development, and experience that it provides. Ultimately, MD Camp strives to increase the number of physicians from backgrounds or areas that are underrepresented in medicine; to that end, they typically accept students who are underrepresented in medicine, whether that be from racial, socio-economic and/or educationally disadvantaged backgrounds, though they encourage all to apply. William D. Squires Scholarship

The William D. Squires Scholarship is primarily financial need-based, but ideal applicants have already selected a career goal and are highly motivated to reach their goal. The Scholarship Selection Committee also considers each student's academic promise. William D. Squires Scholarship applicants must be high school seniors from Ohio but may attend colleges outside of Ohio. The award amount has been increased from \$3,000 per year to \$4,000 and is renewable for a maximum total of \$16,000. Applications close on April 5. [Access application](#)
