## *Charles L. Warren Memorial Heritage Scholarship*

The Charles L. Warren Memorial Heritage Scholarship is awarded by the Ohio Association for College Admission Counseling each year to outstanding high school seniors. The scholarship is a one-time \$1,500 award. It will be given to several outstanding high school seniors and may be used at any Ohio college or university. Students from underrepresented populations with a minimum 3.0 grade point average are eligible to apply. Deadline is January 21. [Online application.](#)

## *National Beta Club Scholarship*

Senior students who are active National Beta members are eligible to apply and participate in the scholarship competition. Selection of National Beta Scholarship winners is based on a number of factors with special emphasis on academic excellence, demonstrated leadership, commendable character, school and community service, as well as National Beta Club involvement. The Otterbein Opportunity Scholarship covers the direct cost of tuition after all federal and state aid, including the federal direct student loan, has been applied, as determined by the FAFSA. ## **The University of Dayton ROTC Scholarship**

**Award Amount: Full Tuition      Deadline: January 1**

Army ROTC scholarships cover four, three, and two-year periods and provide for full tuition and charges, \$1200 a year for books, and a tax-free subsistence allowance of \$300 a month for first year cadets, \$350 a month for sophomore cadets, \$450 a month during the junior year, and \$500 a month in the senior year for up to ten months. Scholarships, which are highly competitive, are awarded to those who demonstrate outstanding scholarly, athletic, and leadership ability.

## **GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program**

**Award Amount: \$10,000 (renewable)      Deadline: January 4**

Awards are for undergraduate and graduate study, and may be used for education-related expenses, including tuition, fees, books, supplies, room, and board. In addition, applicants must demonstrate the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship, demonstrate strong academic performance (minimum 3.0 GPA), demonstrate financial need, be a citizen of the United States of America, and plan to enroll at a four-year college. In addition, semifinalists must be nominated by an eligible community leader, such as a high school principal, elected official, or executive director of a non-profit organization, and must provide documentation to certify academic performance and financial need. Interested students must notify the Guidance Office before proceeding with the application process.

## ***U.S. Department of State Merit-Based Scholarships***

The U.S. Department of State provides over 1,000 merit-based scholarships each year for U.S. high school students to study abroad for a summer or an academic year in over 25 countries. These high school exchange programs prepare young Americans to succeed in the 21st century's global economy by developing their foreign language skills, increasing their cross-cultural understanding, strengthening their leadership capacity, and fostering new academic insights and ambitions. These scholarships include international airfare, tuition, and program costs, as well as meals and living accommodations (often with a host family). ## ***University of Notre Dame Summer Programs 2019***

The University of Notre Dame Summer Scholars participants spend two intense weeks in one of 21 programs of study. Classes are small so that students receive personal attention from Notre Dame faculty. The coursework is a true preview of college academics—it is both rigorous and rewarding, and students earn one college credit upon the completion of a program track. Students collaborate on coursework outside designated class times, as they would in any college setting. ## ***Hispanic Scholarship Fund***

The HSF Scholarship is designed to assist students of Hispanic heritage obtain a college degree. Awards are based on merit; amounts range from \$500 to \$5,000, based on relative need among the Scholars selected. Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and be U.S. citizens, permanent legal residents, DACA, or eligible non-citizens (as defined by FAFSA). The scholarship opens January 1 and closes March 31.
