The Ohio State University MD Camp

June 12 – June 30 The Ohio State University Registration deadline is March 31

MD Camp, sponsored by the Area Health Education Center at The Ohio State University, is looking for applicants for the 2023 MD Summer Camp cohort. MD Camp is a three-week intensive summer camp designed to inspire and motivate students interested in pursuing a career in the health professions, including medicine, biomedical research, and more. MD Camp is an opportunity for rising high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors who might benefit from the intellectual challenge, academic and social development, and experience that it provides. Ultimately, MD Camp strives to increase the number of physicians from backgrounds or areas that are underrepresented in medicine; to that end, they typically accept students who are underrepresented in medicine, whether that be from racial, socio-economic and/or educationally disadvantaged backgrounds, though they encourage all to apply.
