- 1. What is syncretism?
- 2. How and why does syncretism happen?
- 3. The article states, "As a Daoist might say, however, just as water changes its shape to fit the vessel, so do faiths and ideologies change to fit the contexts of the cultures that adopt them." Explain this quote and offer an example.
- 4. How did "Christian missionaries and preachers.... turn Roman infrastructure to their advantage?" In what ways did this lead to syncretic belief systems?
- 5. Who were the Nestorians and how do they reflect the process of syncretism?
- 6. How did the spread of Buddhism along the Silk Roads lead to syncretism in different regions? Offer an example.
- 7. How did political power play a role in reshaping belief systems?
- 8. How did the political adoption of religious belief systems impact the spread of these beliefs?
- 9. So, why does a Nestorian gravestone in Central Asia have both a Western calendar year and a Chinese Zodiac year inscribed upon it?
- 10. What are a couple of examples of syncretism that exist in our world today? (Try to come up with something that is not related to religion.)
